Pre-Conference Workshop{30th November, 2023(Thursday)}:-

The conference marked its beginning with One day **Pre-Conference Workshop** on **30th November, 2023**. Pre-Conference Workshop was aimed at disseminating research fundamentals and enhancing know-how for the tools and techniques used while conducting research.
