

## 7.1.1 Measures initiated by the Institution for the promotion of gender equity during the 2021-22,

#### Response:

#### a. Safety and Security

University ensures the safety and security of all the students, teaching and non-teaching staff members and other employees by adopting significant measures. The whole campus is under CCTV surveillance with cameras installed at all prominent locations. With the help of the cameras, it is easy to identify if any issue persists within the campus. Moreover, security checkpoints are provided all-round the campus at the entries and exits of all academic blocks, libraries, hostels, mess and cafeterias.

Separate hostels are provided to girls with proper security measures, and hostel committees are established to look after the students. The Girl's Hostel is assigned a female warden who is well-trained, responsible and vigilant.

To ensure safety and security university has appointed members for the Proctorial Board who look after the discipline and ensures that everyone follows the rules and regulations of the university. Cases of indiscipline or indecent behaviour of any student, cases of individual/ group harassment, threatsetc. are dealt with strictly by the Proctorial Board.

The University's guard room at the main entrance of the campus has well-trained security guards who ensure that students with valid identity cards are allowed on the campus. They also keep a strict record of all the visitors entering the campus.

Academic buildings are equipped with digital notice boards that display all the instructions, rules and regulations of the university. Moreover, helpline numbers are also displayed on the notice boards so that anyone in need may contact the particular person in case of help. University has also appointed an Antiragging committee to ensure strict implementation of anti-ragging measures.

To maintain COVID protocol buildings are equipped with a face recognition system for the attendance of employees keeping in mind their safety. Regular vaccination drives were also organized by the university for the students and faculty members thereby ensuring their safety.



#### B. Counselling


University provides counselling at all levels not only for students but also for employees. Faculty members counsel students regarding academic performance, career plans and personal issues. Classes in charges are also appointed for every separate semester and course who individually counsel students apart from the subject faculty. Head of the Departments also holds a meeting for interacting with students separately to know about their progress or problems if any. Dean student welfare is appointed by the university to look after student-related problems and their solutions.

#### b. Common Rooms

The university maintains separate common rooms for boys and girls in the hostels to ensure privacy and prevent unwelcome situations. Both staff and students utilize these common areas to rest and socialise. These common rooms are furnished with modern equipment to encourage group learning among students.







# The Responsible Invertian believes that YOU ARE A CREATOR November 17<sup>th</sup> 2021 Report Blood Donation camp

"Anybody can give blood" "Bring a life back to power.

Blood has no boundaries and the distinction of class, community and creed gets wiped

out when good people get together and donate freely.

To facilitate this, cause the blood donation camp was organized by "The Responsible Invertian club" on 17th November 2021, at **Invertis University** in collaboration with **Clara Swain Mission Hospital**, Bareilly under the strong supervision of the Honorable Chancellor Dr. Umesh Gautam, who is also the first person (Mayor) of Bareilly city.

Camp was organized in the memory of our former Prime Minister Late Shri Atal

Vihari Bajpayee ji.

It began at around 10 am and continued up to 3 pm, with a steady stream of donors throughout. The corridor of the seminar hall 1 and 2 of the university was abuzz with young Invertians, happy to be able to play their part in lending a helping hand to people in the region. 40 Students of pharmacy were assisting blood donation camp as volunteer along with their faculty members and they were learning practical aspects of pharmacy.

One of the seminar halls was utilized for a thorough medical check-up of potential donors, while another hall was utilize, where donors could lie down and recuperate for a while before they leave venue.

They were provided with glucose water, food including biscuits, a fruity and a cup of coffee. It was great to see more people than pre-registration numbers turning up in the venue. This stretched the capacity of the blood bank, as a result of which the contact details of the donors were taken so as to allow them to donate at the earliest to the blood bank. The blood bank asked for 100 units with higher number of rear blood groups. Seeing the enthusiasm, they collected thirty percent more, that is 130 units.

Dr. Umesh Gautam (Chancellor), Invertis University) also donates his blood for the great cause and start motivating the blood donors along with the feel of social responsibility, he also informed them that if they want blood at any movement of time hospital will provide them for the same there is no Time/Quantity limit.

Mr. Amritansh Mishra (CEO) The Responsible Invertian Club address the crowled and Invertis University





The samples were carefully sealed and transported away, while the volunteers and hospital staff helped in the clean-up of the area. Throughout the morning, there were smiles and laughter all around - a true embodiment of what we believe in - selfless service with a smile. The donors will receive the certificates of recognition and also get a card where one unit of blood is available free from Mission hospital blood bank in next one year.

We thank all the campus community for coming forward for this great cause. Invertis University and The responsible Invertian team is honored and feel privileged to make Blood Donation camp a great success.
